
PIM schools begin the school year in February and it's not just the teachers involved in preparations. We truly are thankful for

carpenters, plumbers, mechanics, outboard motor drivers and even those who cut the grass. One area where we are grateful for an employee's faithful work is in the obtaining of fuel. Petrol is crucial for the transport of teachers

and supplies to their school allocations. For Joseph Ogmu, (and his wife Colleen in picture) our manager in Wewak, obtaining fuel supplies at the coastal port has been frustratingly difficult for almost a year! Due to foreign currency exchange problems the supply ship carrying fuel arrives sporadically. When it does come Joseph and other customers must wait for days at the fuel depot to get only five petrol drums per shipment (limited by the company) Then the fuel is

loaded on a truck and driven five hours by road to the Sepik River, where the load is transferred manually into dugout canoes, and transported two hours upriver to Ambunti (our base) where it is carefully unloaded.
